In the presentation are several marine fish. You may or may not know the names of them, but what is more important is being able to "cold read" or take clues from their body shape and structures to describe how they survive and thrive in their environment. Use the Read a Fish guide and clues with each individual fish to help you describe the general lifestyle of each species. Under the answer button is the scientific and common name of the fish.

Example: Fish 1: Sunfish This fish has a laterally compressed body which indicates that I am fairly maneuverable, but it also has a somewhat-forked caudal fin which means it is probably moving around a lot and is a decent swimmer. Its eyes are facing forward, which is an indication that it catches its food directly in front of it.
