Reserve scientists conduct research and monitor water, weather, and wildlife so policymakers can make informed science-to-management decisions to protect the health of our ecosystem.

Friends of Rookery Bay supported avian interns and the purchase of the R/V McLeod, a new custombuilt research vessel in place of 'R/V Stella' that was destroyed by Hurricane Irma.

The Reserve and its Rookery Bay Environmental Learning Center are an outdoor and indoor classroom for both children and adults. They serve as dynamic hands-on field trip sites for Collier County 4th and 7th grade students, as well as high school and college students.

Friends of Rookery Bay supported interns, staff and resources critical for implementing educational programs.

FRIENDS OF STEWARDSHIP

Using science to continually improve management practices in the Reserve, staff remove invasive plant and animal species, conduct controlled prescribed burns, and partner with other local agencies to ensure ideal habitat for wildlife and enjoyable recreation space for people throughout Southwest Florida.

Friends of Rookery Bay manages an Adopt A Sea Turtle Nest Program to raise awareness of the Reserve's sea turtle program and provides funds for interns working in the field daily with volunteers and Reserve staff monitoring beaches and protecting nests.

Give Us Props!


Colorful red mangroves sit prominently at water's edge throughout Rookery Bay Research Reserve. They provide habitat for juvenile fish and wading birds, and buffer our coastline when storms approach.

These forests grow stronger when pencil-shaped propagules bloom and drop off the trees into the estuary waters, taking root and growing upwards to build new trees.

Members of our Red Mangrove Society make the same impact as propagules. The steady drop of monthly donations into our coffers helps us grow our support for research, education and stewardship programs throughout the 110,000-acre Rookery Bay Research Reserve.
